Welcome to the February 2024 Edition of the Magazine for the Churches of Anslow, Rolleston-on-Dove and Tutbury.

Dear Friends

I am writing this on Ash Wednesday which this year is also Valentine's day. These two "holidays" fell on the same day in 2018, and will do so again in 2029, then not again for the rest of the century.

At first glance, these two days could not be more different: one is a light-hearted celebration of love and affection, the other a sombre reminder of human mortality, sacrifice, and our utter dependence on God. One is associated with flowers and chocolates, the second with dark smudges on people's foreheads. The words you need to remember to say on Valentine's Day are "I love you." But on Ash Wednesday, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you will return."



This seems a paradox, but when we think about it there may be more linking these days than we initially think. Thinking about this may just be the perfect way for us to begin Lent with its purple colours of preparing and penitence, recalling God as the one love, there at the beginning of our lives and there long after our inevitable end.

Surely, God's story is the ultimate love story? God who chose to give up the glory of Heaven, (Philippians 2 v 6-11) becoming incarnate (made flesh) as the Man, Jesus of Nazareth, whose life sets the example for our lives, whose self-sacrifice, death and resurrection provide the way of us to be forgiven of the all the wrongs we have ever, or will ever do, to be reconciled to God again, restored to the loving relationship God created us for.

St John explains this truth in "the gospel in a nutshell".

"16 For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son,  
that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life".

John 3 verse 16. (UK NIV translation)

I commend the Love of God and the season of Lent to us all.

**NOTES:**

\* **W4A = Worship for All.** A service particularly suitable for children to attend. It is in the context of Communion in Tutbury, and Service of the Word in Rolleston and Anslow. There is usually an activity pack (a wordsearch, crossword, a colouring sheet, a craft related to the service theme) to take home or do in church after the service.

\*\* **When there is a 5th Sunday of a Month** - On 5th Sundays, it is normally our custom to have a combined Benefice service and we rotate the venue around our 3 Churches. However, there will be no Benefice service in March as the 5th Sunday falls on Easter day. Be assured that we are planning to have a separate service of Holy Communion in each of our congregations. The 8am BCP said Holy communion in Rolleston will also recommence after the Winter break on Easter Sunday.

The 5th Sunday after that is **30 June** which is also Tutbury Open Gardens weekend. We are invited to worship as a Benefice together in Tutbury Church at 10am, which also celebrates her 935th birthday this year in August. (NB. the pronoun is "she" and "her" as the "Church is the bride of Christ" = Ephesians 5:22-33).

**Midweek Communion**

Rolleston Thursdays at 9.30am - Common Worship Holy Communion.

This is followed by Coffee Club, 10am to 11.30am in the OGSR.



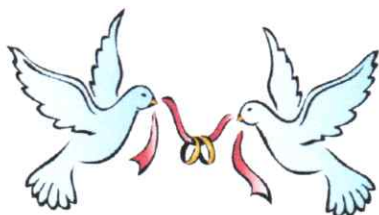

# Thinking Aloud

## ART Benefice Sermon Series – “the what and how of faith”



Dear Friends

February 2024: Why and how should I pray?

### 1. What is Prayer?

Matthew 6 v 5 - 13 Talking to (and with) God – It is a conversation.

When we pray, we pray...

to our Father in Heaven      *Matthew 6 v 9*  
in Jesus' name                *Ephesians 2 v 18*  
helped by the Holy Spirit.      *Romans 8 v 26*

As we pray and spend time with God, God speaks to us - a bible verse, a feeling or thought, a “presence”, a sense of peace.

We need to create space to listen. Prayer is not a shopping list of requests.

We can pray to the Father, to Jesus and or the Holy Spirit.

Prayer can be spoken words, thoughts, and/or hymns/worship songs.

### 2. Why pray?

- a. Prayer is the main way we develop our relationship with God.
- b. Jesus did it, so should we!      *Mark 1 v 35, Luke 6 v 12, Luke 9 v 18, and 28, Luke 11 v 1c.*
- 1c. Rewards of prayer      *Matt 6 v 6*  
Joy                              *John 16 v 24*  
Peace                           *Philippians 4 v 6,7 (a promise!)*

William Temple, 1881 – 1944. Archbishop Canterbury wrote:

“When I pray coincidences happen, when I don’t, they don’t”.

### 3. Does God always answer prayer?

"Yes" "No" "Wait". The answer might be no.

"Either (the things requested) are not good in themselves, or not good for us or for others, directly or indirectly, immediately or ultimately".

John Stott: 1921-2011 Anglican priest and theologian wrote:

“Sometimes an attitude or behaviour stops God answering our prayers.”

- b. Not forgiving someone.              *Matthew 6 v 14,15*
- c. Wrong motives.                        *James 4 v 2,3*

### 4. How do we pray?

a. Arrow prayers      You need the relationship first.

You see something then talk to God about it immediately.

This can also be a private confession moment.

b. Structured prayers      How did Jesus pray?

Think about posture and place.      Eyes open or closed?

Model 1 The Lord's Prayer      *Matthew 6 and Luke 11 v 1.*

Jesus taught the "Lord's Prayer" in answer to that particular question!

Model 2 A C T S

Adoration      You're great, God.

Confession      I'm sorry, God.

Thanksgiving      Thank you, God.

Supplication      Please, God

Model 3      **tsp** Thank you, sorry, please God.

### When should we pray?

a.

Alone - at a set time, a set place, with notebook, your bible.

b. With others - *Matt 18 v 19, 20.* "when 2 or 3 gather, I am there" e.g. in Church services, school or work, small groups, Lent course, with friends, family, at mealtimes, in a Prayer Triplet.

c. Always! *1 Thess. 5 v 17,* - "Pray without ceasing, 18 give thanks in all circumstances" and v 18 - "for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Also, and *Ephesians 6 v18* - "Pray in the Spirit at all times, in every prayer and supplication."

"To be a Christian without prayer is no more possible than to be alive without breathing."

Martin Luther (1483-1546), a German priest, theologian, author, hymnwriter, professor and Augustinian friar.

He was the seminal figure of the Protestant Reformation.

### A Different Take on Lent

#### Do you want to fast this Lent?

*Fast from hurting words, and say kind words.*

*Fast from sadness, and be filled with gratitude.*

*Fast from worries, and have trust in God.*

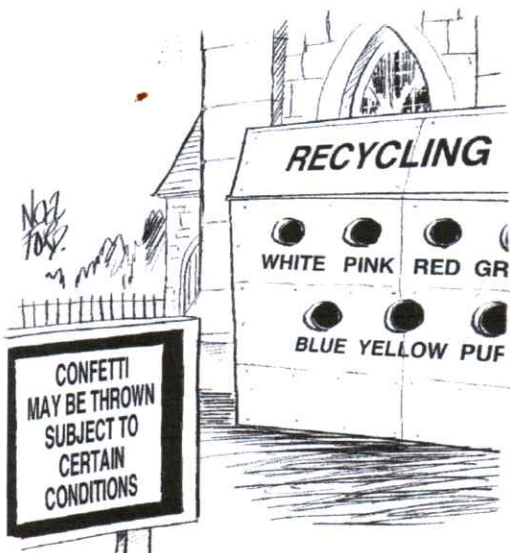

### Benefice Recipe

This month, our Rector has come up with a sure fire favourite with children

#### **Popcorn Peanut "Snickers"**

#### INGREDIENTS

200g chocolate - any sort

Pop corn - I used a sweet salty variety. (You can use Rice Krispies instead).

1/2 cup maple syrup

1/2 cup crunchy peanut butter

Decoration - tubes of sparkly icing, tiny sugar hearts, sprinkles etc

#### METHOD

- Melt the maple syrup and the peanut butter together until runny.
- Melt chocolate in a separate bowl.
- Pour some chocolate into the base of silicon mould shapes. (I used hearts for valentine's day in half term). ..../



/.... - Place popcorn / Rice Krispies in one layer on the liquid chocolate.

- Add a 1.5 table spoonfuls of the maple syrup / peanut butter mix on top

- Set in the fridge for about 30 minutes (time to go for a quick walk to feed the ducks)

- Pour more melted chocolate onto the set "snicker" biscuit. ... **Continued on Page 17**

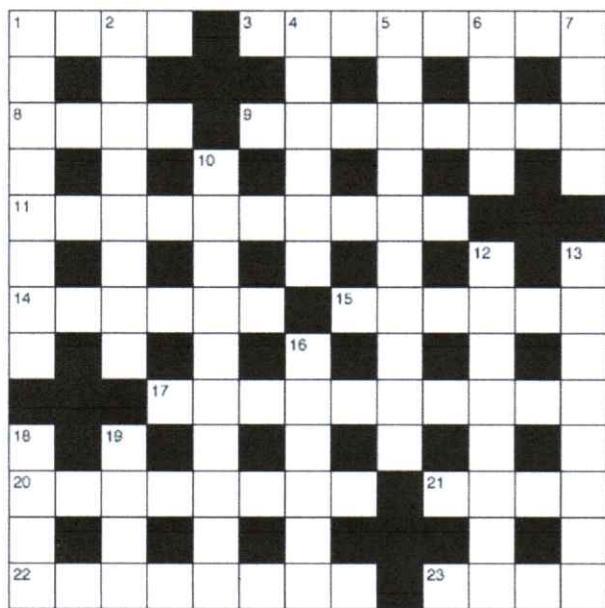

moulds, turn upside down (the flat surface) and decorate.

Depending on what chocolate you use, these are best stored in a fridge and eaten within 1 day - the popcorn can go soft!
