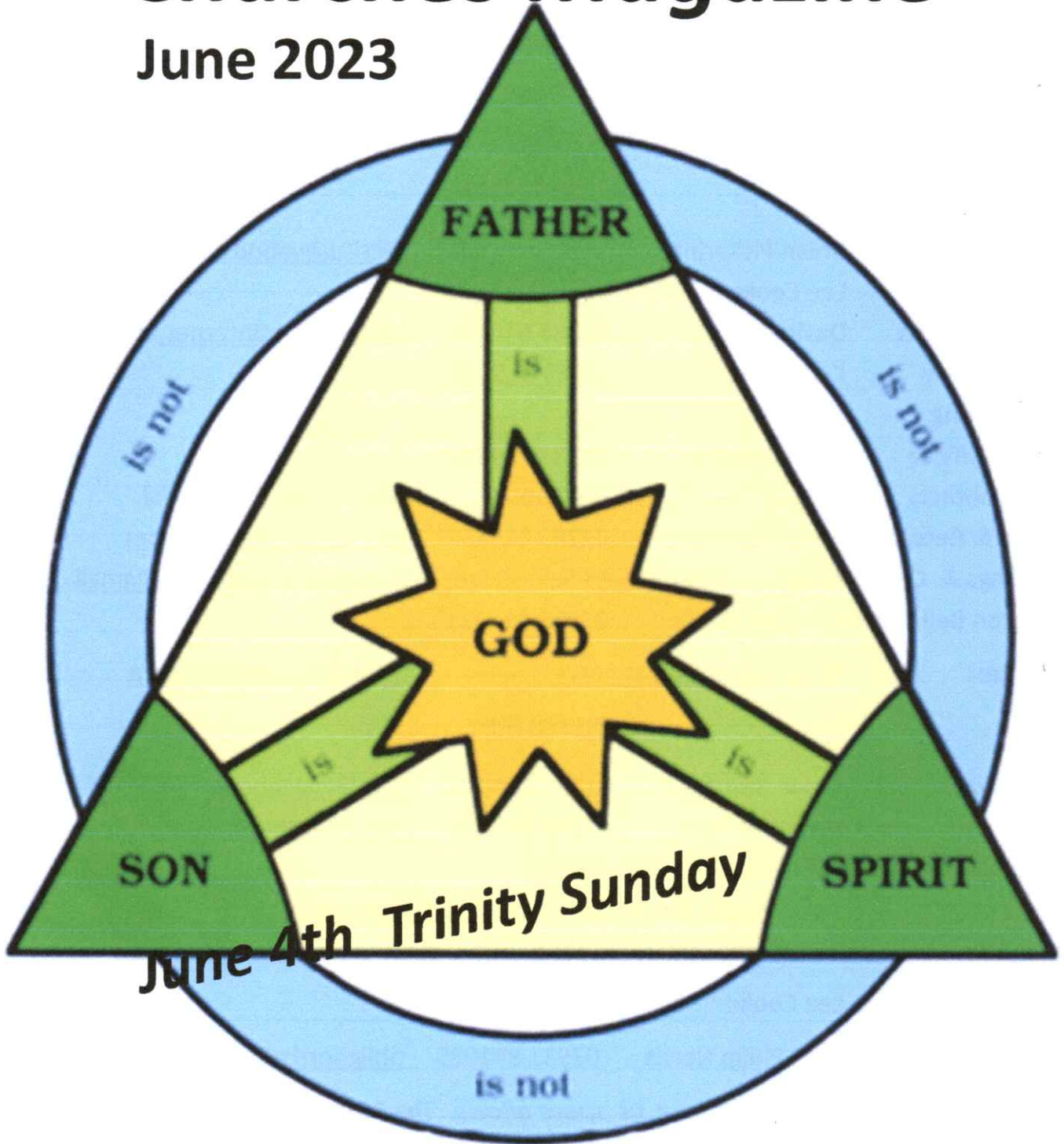

Welcome to the June 2023 Edition of the Magazine for the Churches of Anslow, Rolleston-on-Dove and Tutbury.

Dear Friends

New people, new eras and new prayers

Last weekend was the Coronation of King Charles III. His coronation was the formal affirmation of his new role. The Church of England set aside 28 days of prayer for the King and the nation from Easter Sunday to the Coronation day. In our Benefice, 23 people came into our 3 Church buildings midweek to pray. Others prayed at home using the "Prayer for the King" booklet. Prayers were during the Westminster Abbey service. Prayer is important.



In April, we held our Annual Meetings, electing Wardens, and PCC members. 2023 was also the year to elect Deanery Synod reps. See later in this magazine for the names of our PCC members. In all 3 Annual meetings, we prayed for our new PCCs. Our 6 wardens will be officially "sworn in: on Monday 19 June at the Archdeacon Visitation and prayers will be prayed again. Prayer is important.

The bible reading set for the Sunday following our final Annual Meeting was Acts 2:37-47. Luke summarises the key activities of the early church...42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers". Sadly, I was ill that Sunday, so was unable to preach what I had planned, asking "is God calling us back to the basics of our faith and practice"? In what ways do we help each other grow in discipleship? What additional opportunities might we have to share in fellowship, Biblical teaching, to remember and celebrate Jesus and in prayer? If these 4 aspects were important in the early Church, then they are to feature highly in our congregations today. I welcome ideas of how we can increase these. One suggestion is to continue the prayer opportunities we began with "Prayers for the King". Prayer is important.

Luke continued, "and day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved." As we grow in our discipleship, seeking God in our lives and our worship through the Holy Spirit, people are drawn to belong to such communities of faith, and in time come to believe in Jesus Christ for themselves.

"When I pray, coincidences happen, and when I don't, they don't." (Archbishop William Temple: 1881-1994). Increasingly people are telling me about their "God moments". This is exciting. I believe that prayer fuels faith, witness and mission, in word and action. As we begin a new PCC year, let us pray for them and for each other, so that like the early church, we too will see "God adding to our number those who are being saved".

***W4A** = Worship for All. A service particularly suitable for children to attend. It is in the context of Communion in Tutbury, and Morning Prayer in Rolleston and Anslow.

**** 5th Sundays** - On 5th Sunday mornings, for the moment, we will continue to have a Benefice Communion service at 10am. The venue will alternate between Rolleston and Tutbury Churches.

If you do not live in an ART Benefice parish, you need to contact your local vicar and ask for their goodwill for this pastoral service to take place in a different parish. If you are interested in arranging a baptism, please contact Rev'd Phyllis

The Baptism Certificate states:

This child has begun life as a Christian.

It is the duty of Parents and godparents to see that X goes on according to this beginning and is:

- Trained to pray and taught the Christian life.
- Trained in Christian habits as soon as possible.
- Encouraged to attend church by personal example.
- Helped to be brought to confirmation.

If parents and godparents tell us that they can honestly say these vows, then we baptise their child. The matter is then between them and God.

Please note: You do NOT have to attend church for 3 months before you can have a baptism. Our practice is to invite parents and godparents to attend a baptism information evening before a date of service is agreed. This is the chance for the family to meet the church team and to hear the serious vows of commitment that will be said in the service. It also gives space to ask questions about faith

Our New Parochial Church Councils

All 3 Annual meetings have now taken place. The following people have been elected and appointed to serve.

NB. All 3 churches have adopted the national guidelines of a 1/3 of PCC members retire each year. They can stand again immediately again for election.

Anslow and Tutbury have both passed a resolution to suspend Churchwarden Measure 2001 guideline that disqualifies a Churchwarden for standing for re-election if they have served for 6 consecutive years.

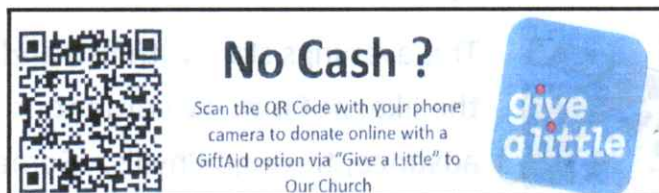
Our Church provided a magnificent auditorium with its wonderful acoustics for the magnificent music.

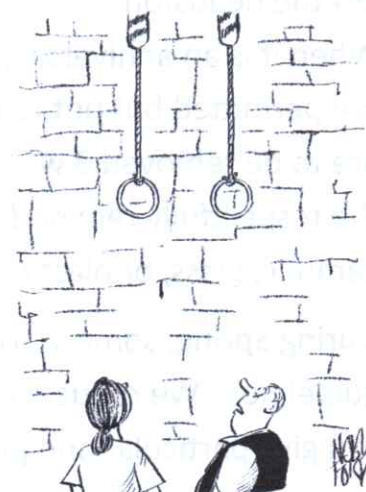

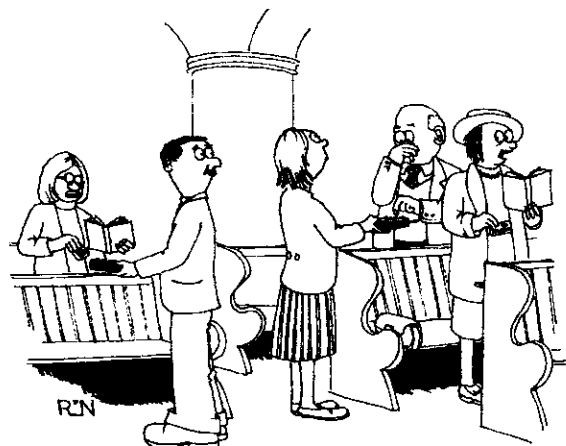
A paid Post of a Part-time Benefice Administrator.

Rocky Road

- 120g Butter
- 120g Milk Chocolate
- 120g Golden Syrup
- 240g Digestive Biscuits (or Gluten free variety) crushed
- 90g Glace Cherries
- 30g Desiccated Coconut (optional)
- 60g Marshmallows – chopped or the mini ones



Method



Grease an 18cm shallow tin.
Gently heat the butter and syrup in a pan. Stir in the broken chocolate until melted. Add in the other dry ingredients. Stir well and press into tin.
Chill for 2 hours until set. Cut into squares and enjoy it.

Have you ever driven passed or even used Anslow Village Hall and wondered; who were the people that run it and keep it in good order: well read on.

The Hall was officially opened on 23rd August 1952 and we celebrated the 70th Anniversary event, on 11th September 2022.

It is run by a committee of Trustees, (seven at the moment, which includes a Chairman and Treasurer), but if this hall is to remain open and in good order for another 70 years, then we need more people to come forward and volunteer to become Trustees. In the normal scheme of things, this is not an onerous task, perhaps six meetings a year.

The hall is popular with classes ranging from Bridge, Yoga, Pilates, Martial Arts to children's dance and Anslow WI.

However we have been running for nearly a year without a Secretary, which is putting a considerable strain on the remaining Trustees, this post **MUST** be filled ASAP.

So have you a few hours a week to spare. Do you like meeting people? Can you discuss problems with contractors? Can you set up meetings, send out agendas, take minutes, keep the other Trustees informed on a regular basis, keep risk assessments up to date, and all the other small myriad tasks that are needed to help run a village hall? **WELL WE NEED YOU!**

Without sufficient trustees to help run the hall, especially a secretary, there is a danger it will have to close. This is not a threat just an actual fact of life!
