The Baptism Certificate states:

This child has begun life as a Christian.

It is the duty of Parents and godparents to see that the person goes on according to this beginning and is:

- Trained to pray and taught the Christian life.
- Trained in Christian habits as soon as possible.
- Encouraged to attend church by personal example.
- Helped to be brought to confirmation.

If parents and godparents tell us that they can honestly say these vows, then we baptise their child. The matter is then between them and God.

Please note: You do NOT have to attend church for 3 months before you can have a baptism. Our practice is to invite parents and godparents to attend a baptism information evening before a date of service is agreed. This is the chance for the family to meet the church team and to hear the serious vows of commitment that will be said in the service. It also gives space to ask questions about faith

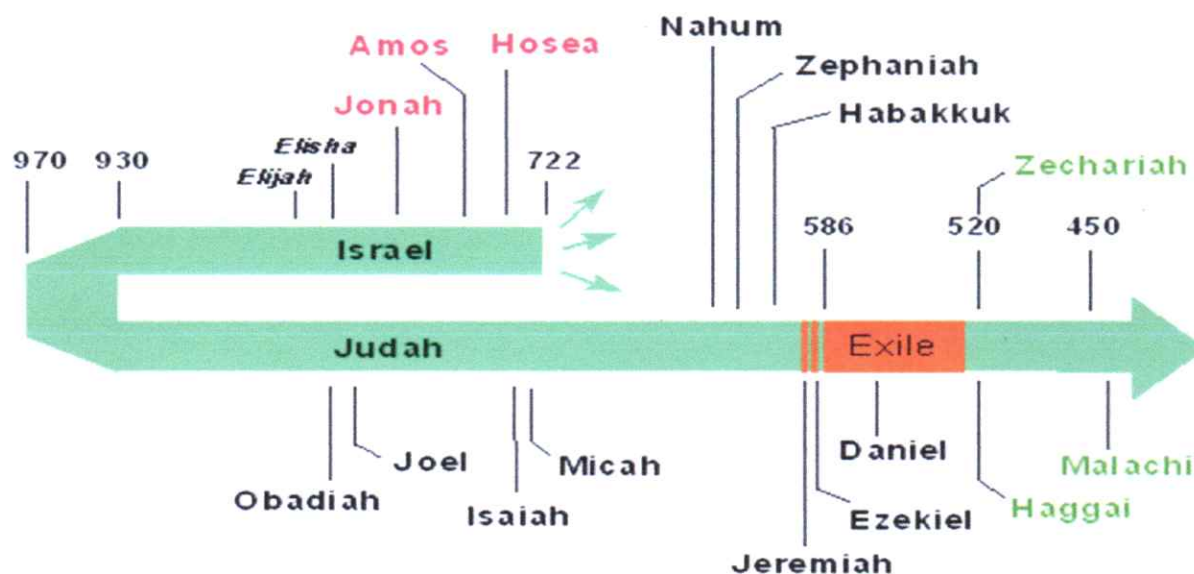
Summer Sermon Series: Heroes of Faith 3

What can we learn about God from the life of X?

We are continuing our summer tradition when we come off the lectionary set bible readings for each Sunday and instead, we look at people in the Bible. In 2021 we looked at people whose stories are told in Genesis and Exodus.

In 2022 we looked at people within the “Judges and Kings” era. In summer 2023, we are looking at people in the “Exiles and prophets” era is the 500 years of 930BC – 430BC.

After the death of King Solomon, his son, Rehoboam caused a division in Israel in 930BC. The Northern Kingdom remained as Israel and 10 of the 12 tribes settled there. This area later became Samaria. The Southern Kingdom was called Judah, and two tribes, Judah and Benjamin, settled there. The southern kingdom retained Jerusalem as their capital city. The two kingdoms appointed their own kings.

Prophets in the Northern Kingdom included Hosea, Amos, Elijah and Elisha. Jonah was also in the northern kingdom. The northern kingdom was defeated by the Assyrians in 722BC. The southern Kingdom survived the Assyrians attack. Prophet from the southern kingdom include Isaiah, Micah and Joel. In 597BC, the Babylonians, under King Nebuchadnezzar, conquered Jerusalem. The city was destroyed with the city wall and temple smashed. All able bodied-Jews had to make the 500-mile journey into exile in Babylon, modern day Iraq.

In Babylon the prophet Ezekiel spoke God’s words to the people. Other key people included Daniel, and his three friends Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. (see Daniel chapter 3). Esther is another person of this era.

/Continued from Page 7... The Persians then defeated the Babylonians and in 538BC, the Jewish exiles were allowed to return home. The first wave of people began to rebuild the temple. They were encouraged by the prophets Haggai and Zechariah. Later Nehemiah brought fresh resources to rebuild Jerusalem and its walls. Along with Ezra, Nehemiah reformed the nation's spiritual life, the people returned to faith in God.

The Old Testament ends with the Children of Israel back in the Promised Land, but many prophecies and promises remain unfulfilled. The last Old Testament prophet Malachi (around 450BC) (3 v 1) declares the greatest promise. No genuine prophetic voice was then heard for the next 450 years. God in the film 'Bruce Almighty' calls this the "dark ages".

"I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the LORD, whom you are seeking, will come to his Temple". *Malachi 3 v 1.*

Communion in Tutbury

Tutbury PCC and the congregation have been discussing the return to the shared chalice after the restrictions on health grounds, were imposed during the Pandemic period.

Whilst the results of the survey conducted recently were perhaps surprising, the Tutbury PCC have agreed, for 2nd, 3rd and 4th Sundays i.e. for the formal services, The celebrant will go along the row (their left to right) and give the bread with drop of wine already on it.

If a person does not want to receive the shared chalice, they leave the rail at that point. If a person does wish the shared chalice they remain at the rail.

The Eucharist Assistant / server will give the chalice into their hand, the person takes a sip and passes the chalice back to the server. However, dipping the bread into the wine is not allowed. This change was enacted on Sunday, 18th June.

In Worship for all we will just keep to bread pre-dripped with wine as at present

Brass Cleaners in Rolleston Church

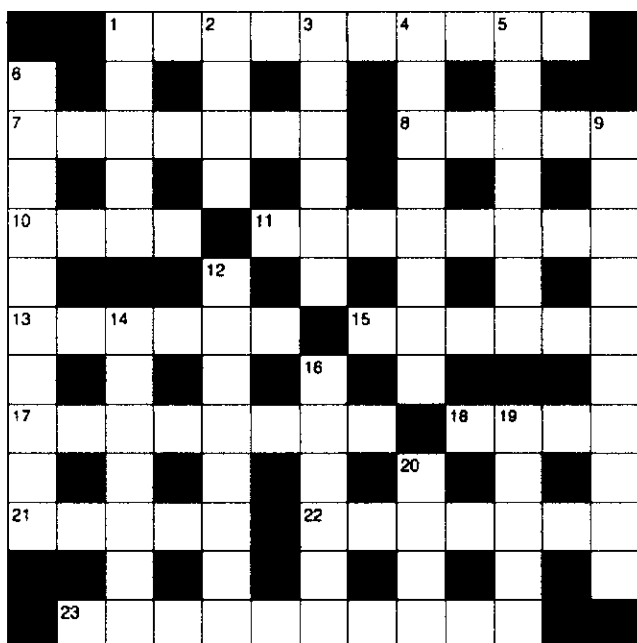

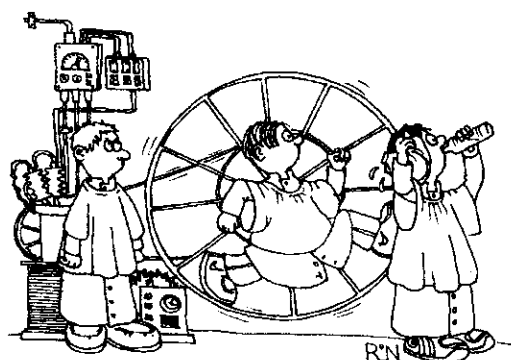

Benefice Recipes

This Month, the Benefice Recipe is courtesy of Anslow Churchwarden, Pat Lawley

Gluten-free Lemon Drizzle Cake

- 150g (5oz) margarine,
- 150g (5oz) caster sugar,
- 2 medium eggs,
- 150 g (5oz) gluten free self-raising flour,
- zest of 1 lemon ,



for the drizzle:

- The juice of 1 lemon and
- One 15ml (1tbsp) of caster sugar.

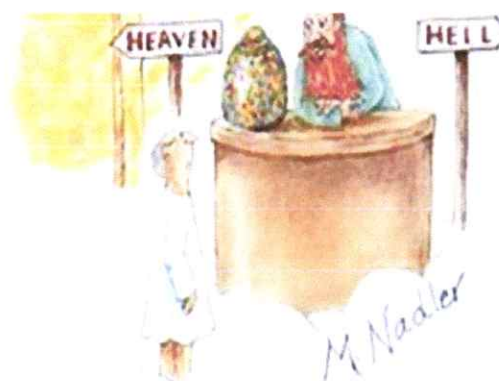
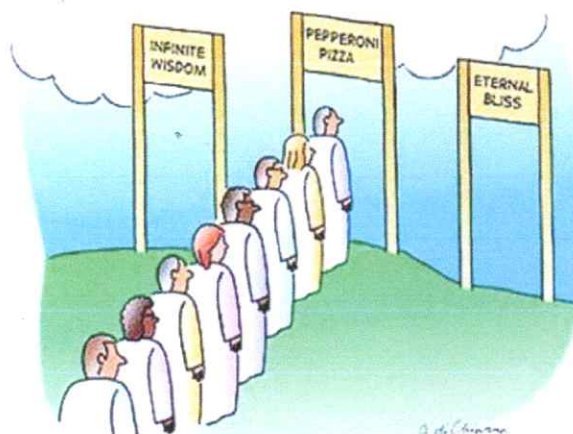
Method



Cream together with a wooden spoon or electric mixer the margarine, caster sugar until the mixture becomes light and fluffy , break the eggs one at a time into the mixture and add 1 15ml (1tbsp) of flour beat thoroughly continue until both eggs are added , add the lemon zest, fold in the flour, place in a loaf tin sized 20x13x9cm (2 lb) that has been lined with grease proof paper or a paper baking case.

Place in the oven set at 180c gas mark 4 for about 35 minutes . When cooked prick the cake over with a testing needle and spoon over the lemon juice mixed with sugar. Leave to cool in the tin because the cake will easily crumble when warm.
