Dear Friends

Finally, Spring seems to have arrived. Tulips are appearing as well as my garden filling up with all the beautiful varieties of primroses we have planted in the last couple of years. We really enjoy people stopping to look over our wall and the irises will be in bloom by the time you read this.



We have come through the hard times of Lent which seemed especially tough this year with cold wind and rain, but the temperature also seems to have turned a corner with highs of 18 Deg.C this week as has our Church Year as we celebrated the high point of the Resurrection of Jesus, and we now wait for the Ascension, 18 May, and then the celebration of the birth of the Church at Pentecost on 28 May.

In each of our villages, there are signs of new beginnings in the churches. It is good that new people coming to church, more people attended the 2 Lent courses, more people are praying the 4 weeks until the Coronation and we praise God for each of these green shoots of life. But sometimes we wonder what are we supposed to do with this "new life" God has given us?

I was given a bunch of flowers this week and among them were some hyacinths. I put them in a vase in the Rectory sitting room and over the next few hours their perfume filled the house. A pleasing aroma.

I was reminded of the verse from 2 Corinthians 2 v 15, "For we are the aroma of Christ to God among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing".

We are to be like a perfume that fills our villages with the love of God and the knowledge of his Son, our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

As we look at the new flowers coming into bloom, and we smell the summer scents in the air, let us ask ourselves, in what new ways can we be the "aroma of Christ" in our villages, among our families and friends, and continue to see the green shoots of new Christian life?



"Prayers for the King"


The Coronation of King Charles III will take place on Saturday 6 May 2023 at Westminster Abbey, in a service steeped in centuries of tradition and rich in Christian symbols and values. To mark this important moment in our nation's life, the Church of England has

compiled this series of Daily Prayers in a booklet.

From Easter Day (9 April) to Coronation Day (6 May), this booklet provides a daily theme, a Bible reading, a reflection, and prayer for use by individuals, churches or groups who wish to use these days to:

- * pray for The King, our nation and the world
- * explore the symbolism of the Coronation service
- * reflect on Jesus, the Servant King.

It also includes prayers for The King and the Royal Family for use in years to come. One hundred copies of the booklet were ordered and given out in our 3 churches. We are hosting prayer on every day for these 4 weeks using the set liturgy (words) of intercessions, silence, "post it" and other



Churchyard Reminder

With respect to grieving families, the Parochial Church Councils (PCCs) wish to remind everyone of the Lichfield Diocesan Churchyard regulations. Our churchyards are places in which to reflect and remember for our whole community. They are also subject to restrictions for the benefit, safety, and fairness of all who visit.

We ask you to note - Before a headstone is in place, only one free-standing floral arrangement or container is permitted, and it is to be placed where the headstone will be.

Once an upright or flat headstone is placed, only one floral tribute or planter is permitted ON the headstone. When it is an anniversary of the loved one's birth, death, or Christmas, more arrangements are permitted but not to encroach on neighbouring grave spaces. These additional tributes are to be removed 3 weeks after the said anniversary.

We respectfully remind families that "gardens", edgings, curbs, pebbles stone chippings, ceramic, glass, or plastic ornaments are not permitted in Anglican Churchyards.

During Spring, work will be done in the three churchyards to return them to the Diocesan guidelines. We request families to work on their own loved ones' graves please. The relevant Church's PCC can give particular and personalised advice on what is acceptable or not.

If a family wishes to be exempt from the Diocesan guidelines, then a faculty (a legal permission) can be applied for from the Diocesan lawyer. There is a cost to the family for this.


A Paid Post of Part-time Benefice Administrator.


