I have the honour to be asked to write the pastoral letter in this month's magazine. I am no stranger to this sort of task as it has often been something I have done in the years of ministry prior to my retirement at the end of 2012, when I came to live in Rolleston.

May holds a couple of major events. This year we celebrate the eightieth anniversary of VE Day on Thursday 8th May. We shall obviously be including this in our Church Services. Like so many, I was born just after the war and so I cannot comment on the joy and relief felt on that original day. I have seen the newsreels of people dancing in the street and the smiles and hugs that went around. I expect that if I had endured six years of warfare, night after night of air raids, never knowing if you would see loved ones again, not to mention the rationing, I too would have had a cheshire cat sized grin on my face also.

Yet as I write this letter, the news has just broken of an earthquake in Myanmar with the current death toll standing at 1,600 people. There is the never-ending warfare between nations, the violence in our cities. It makes us feel that there is not a lot to grin about.

I have been fortunate to have had my left knee replaced. From the moment I was released from hospital I have found an army of loving, caring, thoughtful people who wished me well. It was not just the offers of help, but just to know that someone cares.

That brings me to the second major event this May. The Ascension of Jesus. The day He went back to heaven, so that He was not bound by time and space, but could be with everyone, everywhere. Warfare and disasters are not God's doing, but He wants to be invited into our lives, the good, the bad, the joy and the pain He is willing, eager to share and help us through.

This is what are Churches are for, to help those who are seeking this joyous relationship with our living Saviour. If this is all news to you, please come and ask.

Benefice Confirmations - 6th July

Following invitations announced in Benefice Churches recently for persons wishing to reconfirm their faith though the sacrament of Confirmation, we have been informed that Bishop Matthew will be presiding at a Confirmation Service to be held at St Mary's Priory Church, Tutbury at 10am on Sunday, 6th July.

'We care passionately about the closed Tutbury castle'

Villagers have voiced concerns about the future of an historic castle where Mary Queen of Scots was once held prisoner.

The 11th Century Tutbury Castle, in Tutbury, Staffordshire, has been closed to the public since the end of July 2024 after its curators retired.

The ongoing closure has sparked concerns over when it would be reopened, with councillors claiming it was affecting high street businesses.

Tutbury parish councillor David Bull told BBC Midlands Today: "As a village, we care passionately about this castle. It's part of the lifeblood of the village."

According to Staffordshire county councillor Philip White, the castle's closure had caused footfall to go down .../

/.... on the high street.

He said it had been "a worry for local businesses", but there was an opportunity "if the castle were to become a bigger attraction, which I think it could with the story of Mary Queen of Scots that people are so interested in."

Benefice Recipe

Caramelised Orange Cake

This Italian recipe is a great *pezzo forte* accompaniment to a teatime feast for a special occasion. It serves 6 to 8 persons. Warning! This is for the sweet-tooth and **not** for the calorie conscious.

Recipe

160g butter, softened at room temperature, plus extra for greasing
200g caster sugar
1 orange, cut into ½cm
(¼") slices
3 eggs, beaten
220g self-raising flour
200g ground almonds
A pinch of salt
Grated zest of ½ an orange
2tbsp thin-cut orange marmalade
Thin slivers of orange peel to decorate

Method

- I. Preheat the oven to 180°C/Gas Mark 4. Lightly grease an 18 20cm (7½" 8") round cake tin. Line it with greaseproof paper.
- 2. To make the caramel, dissolve half the sugar in the water in a small pan

/.... over a medium heat, then increase the heat to a boil. Wait a few minutes and, as

soon as it changes to a caramel colour, remove from the heat, and stir in 24g of



the butter. Immediately pour the mixture into the prepared cake tin, ensuring it lines the bottom evenly. Arrange the orange slices evenly over the sugar mixture and set aside.

- 3. In a bowl, whisk together the remaining butter and sugar until creamy; add the eggs, flour, ground almonds, salt and orange zest. Pour the mixture into the tin. Bake in the oven for 50 minutes: to check if it is cooked, insert a wooden skewer. If it comes out clean, the cake is ready. If not clean, leave for say another 5 minutes and test again. Remove from the oven and leave to rest for 5 minutes, then remove from the in and place on a flat plate with the orange slices on top.
- 4. Heat the orange marmalade in a small saucepan with a little water, then brush over the top of the cake as a glaze. Decorate with the orange peel and serve.




